Supporting Children & Families

Over the past quarter, our staff have continued to support child victims and their families through providing a wide array of services to the children & families in our center, as well as those in the community.

ACCAC staff have conducted over 50 Forensic Interviews for child victims, 6 of whom decided to have a Medical Exam or Consult.

Our Mental Health program added 7 new cases and conducted over 150 therapy sessions. 20 referrals were made to outside mental health providers.

Our Child & Family Advocates conducted 4 non-offending caregiver education sessions and provided an average of 30 hours of support each month to families.

Based on the hard work & collaboration of our MDIT, law enforcement & the DA's office were able to press charges on 8 of the cases served at the center.

The MDIT has also held 3 case review meetings, working together to share information, make decisions on cases, and most importantly, collaborating on how to continue supporting families through the investigation process.

Over 2,100 community members (adults and children) were provided child abuse prevention information and resources through our Prevention Education and Community Outreach efforts in schools & the local community.

1st Annual Golf Tournament

On September 29th, ACCAC held our 1st annual "Chip In For Kids" golf tournament. It was a beautiful fall day at the beautiful Links in Gettysburg golf course, where 28 teams participated.
