Adams County Children's Advocacy Center (ACCAC), located in Gettysburg, PA, seeks a full time Outreach and Education Coordinator to join our team. ACCAC's Outreach and Education Coordinator plays a pivotal role in ACCAC's mission to engage and educate community partners/stakeholders to reduce, and ultimately, to end child abuse in our community and to support child victims of abuse and their family members from initial outcry to hope and healing.

The ideal candidate will possess the skills and experience to:

- Develop outreach and education activities promoting child abuse prevention education to the community. This includes public events, presentations, news media coverage, website content, social media, podcasts, videos, and printed materials.
- Seek creative approaches to engaging and educating the Adams County, Pennsylvania community.
- Work with agency staff and stakeholders to identify information, resources, and content to be shared via a variety of communication platforms and methods.
- Assist ACCAC's Executive Director and Board of Directors in identifying, implementing, and managing community partnerships in support of the agency's dedication to preventing child abuse.

Adams County Children's Advocacy Center (ACCAC) is working to prevent child abuse and to help child victims and their families heal from the trauma of abuse. ACCAC is dedicated to a community where children are safe, families are strong, and our child victims can be children again.

ACCAC's program consists of three primary service modalities: 1. Community based child abuse prevention education, 2. Intervention/investigation of suspected child abuse and neglect cases and 3. Psychoeducational and mental health treatment services for child abuse victims and their family members.

Since 2006, ACCAC has conducted child abuse prevention education services for more than 15,000 Adams County community members and provided more than 2,400 child abuse victims with supports and services: forensic interviews, child/family advocacy, case management, medical examinations, caregiver education and mental health services.

ACCAC is fully accredited by the National Children's Alliance, with child-focused, community-based programming that brings together representatives from many different disciplines- law enforcement, child protection, prosecution, mental health, medical and victim advocacy- to work together as a multidisciplinary investigative team (MDIT)- conducting forensic interviews and making team decisions about the investigation, treatment, management, and prosecution of child abuse cases.

ACCAC is positioned to enter its next chapter supporting child victims of abuse from initial outcry to hope and healing while working to reduce, and ultimately, to end child abuse in our community. The Center will soon transition to a larger facility in the heart of Gettysburg. The new location will allow the Center to increase its services to the community; offer more child abuse prevention education to the public and expand treatment options for child abuse victims and their families.
