Adams County Children's Advocacy Center (ACCAC), located in Gettysburg, PA, seeks a master's Level Mental Health Therapist to join our team of innovative professionals dedicated to building brighter tomorrows for victims of child abuse and their family members.

The position includes support towards licensure under LPC supervision and agency paid training in evident-based treatment modalities.

In this position, you will provide therapeutic services to children and adolescents who have been direct or indirect victims of physical and/or sexual abuse, neglect, and/or who have witnessed family violence.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Facilitate individual therapy sessions for victims ages 3 through 18 utilizing evidence-based treatment modalities.
- Willingness to pursue training/certification in evidence-based treatment modalities: TF-CBT, EMDR, PCIT, AF-CBT, CFTSI, etc.
- Interpret trauma assessment instruments and develop treatment plans.
- Participate in regular Multidisciplinary Investigative Team (MDIT) meetings.
- Collaborate with MDIT members, providing case update/coordination activities.

ACCAC offers a hybrid work schedule, combining in-office sessions with remote/telehealth sessions. Salary commensurate with experience, \$50,000+. Employee benefits include health insurance, 403B, life & disability insurance, generous paid leave, and work/life balance considerations.

Since 2006, ACCAC has conducted child abuse prevention education services for more than 20,000 Adams County community members and provided more than 2,600 child abuse victims with supports and services: child/family advocacy, case management, forensic interviews, medical examinations, caregiver education and mental health services. All services are free, thanks to the generosity of individuals, businesses, organizations, and public agencies. ACCAC is a child-focused, community-based program that brings together representatives from many different disciplines- law enforcement, child protection, prosecution, mental health, medical, and victim advocacy to work together as a multidisciplinary investigative team (MDIT) keeping children safe and families strong in our community.
