It takes a very special kind of person to sit with these children and their caregivers day after day, to hear what they have to share, to sit with them in the pain they are experiencing, and to walk beside them in their journey towards hope and healing.

In the words of one caregiver, "Thank You for Allowing My Family to be Heard."

The ACCAC team is equally dedicated to preventing future child abuse. Team members conduct school and community-based prevention education, host special events, hand out resources at public events, collaborate with other community service agencies, and yes, even dress up as crayons in the Halloween Parade! All to promote ACCAC's vision: a community in which children are safe and families are strong, and that all children deserve the chance for a brighter tomorrow.
